On the national level, a new brand manual has been approved. When I first heard about this, I thought "Oh what now". But after reading it, I like the new regulations. The SAR has had a branding problem for many years. The population at large has no idea what the SAR is.

Part of the problem are the titles that the different SAR organization levels have. The state level has been "The Kansas Society of the Sons of the American Revolution". This has been shortened to "Kansas SAR". Our Chapter's title has been changed to "Delaware Crossing Chapter SAR".

The term, society and the reference to the State, has been eliminated from the titles. The new branding emphasizes that we are the SAR and hopefully the SAR brand will become synonymous with our mission statement: "The Sons of the American Revolution honors our Revolutionary War patriot ancestors by promoting patriotism, serving our communities, and educating and inspiring future generations about the founding principles of our country."

Wreaths Across America

The Wreaths Across America wreath laying event at Johnson County Memorial Gardens (JCMG) is soon approaching. It will be on Saturday December 16 at 11 am Eastern Time all across our nation and beyond. Our Delaware Crossing Chapter members have made us the largest sponsoring group at JCMG since the even began there. Our involvement has encouraged the Monticello Chapter KSSSAR and some KSDAR Chapters to participate at JCMG as Sponsoring Groups. We should continue to be the leader.

I just want to remind you that for every wreath you sponsor, Wreaths Across America sends \$5.00 to our Delaware Crossing Chapter. That \$5.00 is split 50% to the Veterans Fund and 50 % to the Kesler Youth Endowment Fund. Therefore, you not only honor veterans by laying wreaths; it helps us to Remember, Honor, Teach.

As of the writing of the article we now have 216 wreaths sponsored for this year's event. The deadline for sponsoring a wreath is November 28th.

You may go online to sponsor by Credit Card or you may complete the accompanying form and mail a check to Wreaths Across America. To sponsor online follow the directions on the accompanying KS0027P, WAA Day Poster and proceed. Where it tells you to go to the website, just click on it.

If for some reason that should not work for you, then click on the following link. Home - Wreaths Across America, click on Local Sponsor Group in the center of the webpage, check the number of wreaths you wish to sponsor, then fill in Select Group Sponsor with Delaware Crossing Chapter KSSAR.

Your sponsorship, donation, is greatly appreciated. If you wish to make a Grave Specific Sponsorship. Click on **Specific Cemetery** in the middle of the webpage. Type in the name of the cemetery, if it appears click on it, then **Grave Specific** and proceed. You will need the name of the person and grave plot for a wreath to be laid there.

Twelve local Chapters of the KSDAR were invited to participate in the Flag Retirement Ceremony following the picnic. Eight of those Chapters had representatives who participated in retiring flags by fire. The chapters were as follows, James Ross Chapter, John & Hattie Possum Chapter, Mission Hills Chapter, Olathe Chapter, Shawnee Mission Chapter, Three Trails West Chapter, Tomahawk Chapter, and Quivira Crossing Chapter. This is the greatest number of KSDAR Chapters represented at any of our Flag Retirement Ceremonies.

A Certificate of Commendation in recognition of service to the community for proper retirement of

Outreach at Gardner Historical Museum

On Saturday September 23 the Gardner Historical Museum had a celebration of its 20th Anniversary. Our Delaware Crossing Chapter members displayed items from the Delaware Crossing Chapter had a booth at the celebration at which our Patriot Chests items were displayed and attempts to inform the public of Sons of the American Revolution were made. Dewey arrived at 8 am and helped volunteer set up the pop-up tent and a table furnished by the museum. An additional table provided by Dewey was also set up. Dennis Nelson soon arrived as we ready to set the displayed items and promotional pamphlets on the tables. Also arriving was a rain storm. It rained very hard at times. It tapered off and stopped for awhile around 10:30 am. We

positioned the items from the Patriot Chests on the table, which took until noon as we had to cover at times due to intermittent showers and we were requested to listen to one of the featured guest speakers at 11:00 am.

The effect of the rain was that very few of the general public visited the celebration. We got to talk to three men about potential membership to the SAR and to two young elementary school students about the items on display.

Gary Hicks of our chapter was one of the featured speakers. He portrayed Alexander Majors and American Freight Pioneer and a Co-Founder of the Pony Express. His freight pioneering included the Santa Fe Trail. Alexander Majors was an early prominent resident of the Kansas City, Missouri region.

Alexander Majors was so much a contributor it took Gary over an hour to present his program. Gary must have thought Dewey Fry fell asleep and nearly fell out of his chair when one leg of the chair suddenly sank in the mud.

Two photos of Gary are included. One him giving his presentation and one of him called on his cellphone in the mid-1800's checking the progress of a shipment on the Santa Fe Trail. It is amazing how Gary closely resembles to appearance of Alexander Majors.
