146 5th grade students participated in the poster contest this year at Pioneer Ridge Middle School in the Gardner-Edgerton School District. On Thursday February 27, Compatriots Larry Tatum, Gary Hicks, Dan Dryer, and Dewey Fry judged the 18 posters selected by the 5th grade teachers to be the finalists.

This year, a winner, 2nd place and 3rd place were chosen. A program was presented attended by the all the 5th grad students, their teachers and the Principal. Dan Dryer was the program MC and was aided by Dewey Fry, Steve French and Gary Hicks.




Figure 1 Dewey Fry, Audrey Gainer, Rhemi Pascal, Kayden Stoffal & Steven French




