Senator Marshall plans to speak about current events on Capitol Hill including the results of the mid-term elections and the latest legislation that he has co-sponsored with Senator Elizabeth Warren (D-MA); the Digital Asset Anti-Money Laundering Act of 2022. This bipartisan legislative proposal should be of keen interest given the recent developments around the collapse of FTX and certain parts of the crypto economy.

Senator Marshall will also cover additional bipartisan legislative efforts including food for medicine, addressing credit card swipe fees, environmental and energy matters.

Baseball Coaches Who Save Life of Teenager are to be Recognized

Seventeen-year-old Blue Valley High School Student Davis Dwight was practicing at Mac N Seitz in August, 2022, when he collapsed.

Per their own words "It's an incident that keeps me up at night at times. It's an incident that fills my mind and my heart," Crouch said. "I was having a typical conversation with a 17-year-old kid about a situation that happened earlier with him – he broke his wood bat — and then two minutes into the conversation he just passed out."

Crouch yelled for help and called 911. Coach and former Royals catcher Mike Macfarlane came running. Dwight was not breathing.

"I started compressions right away. Still couldn't feel a pulse. I was scared, praying, hollering — get help," Macfarlane said. "Things got real serious when he started turning blue, gasping at times for air, but still no pulse, no reactions, no anything."

They were informed their actions in those critical 12 minutes saved the youths life. As it turned out it was his heart failing, the doctors at the hospital were able to stabilize him and place and external defibrillator on him while they continue to determine the cause.

Davis Dwight spent five days in ICU, of his one week in the hospital; one week later he went back to school. He has since started a project to have defibrillators placed in schools for future use in life saving. Someday those defibrillators may save another life as those who have been trained in CPR, as Mike Macfarlane and Nik Crouch have, may not be around. Additionally, with Davis Dwight encouragement, the evening of Tuesday October 25, 2022, at Blue Valley High hundreds of people received CPR training.

There has been a delay in our Delaware Crossing Chapter recognizing Mike Macfarlane and Nik Crouch due to prior meeting dates being in conflict with events such as a championship baseball tournament and a hip replacement surgery on Mike since we first talked. However, as they never gave up on applying CPR, they also never gave up on accepting recognition for their act; both are scheduled to be at our January 21, 2023 Chapter Meeting to be presented the SAR Life Saving Medal.
