
After some discussion at the February BOG, it was decided that the \$25 registration fee would not be

# Elementary School Poster Contest at Pioneer Ridge Middle School

An annual event is the Poster Contest at Pioneer Ridge Middle School in the Gardner Edgerton School District. It is unusual that the Fifth Grade is in Middle School, but it is in Gardner Edgerton Schools.

The Fifth Grade is the grade that has been designated by the State of Kansas as the grade in which history of the Revolutionary War is taught, that is what qualifies PRMS fifth grade students for the Elementary School Poster Contest.

151 students participated, 18 finalist posters were chosen by the 6 Fifth Grade teachers. Delaware

Crossing Chapter judges selected the top three, Third, Second and First and recognized the students who created them at the end of the judging. After the program in the auditorium, the students enjoyed cupcakes and juice boxes.

The program was presented by Delaware Crossing Members. Dan Dryer was Master of Ceremonies, Larry Tatum, Dennis Nelson and Dewey Fry displayed flags as Dan Dryer described each of 9 flags.

Dewey Fry described a Brown Bess to the students and teachers and demonstrated how to cut a 5-pointed star with one cut of the scissors as was done by Betsy Ross.

The teachers were presented Certificates of Appreciation and miniature Liberty Bells, that did ring, for their assistance and support of the program.

Each teacher received a very vocal response and applause from the students.

In the past several years, the Delaware Crossing Chapter's top three winners have come from Pioneer Ridge Middle School. That decision will have to be delayed a bit, as there is at least one, and maybe two more entries from students other than at Pioneer Ridge Middle School. These one or two additional posters are due by March 4, which is after the writing of this article.

They will be judged competitively with the three from Pioneer Ridge and the top three will be announced at our March 11, Chapter Meeting.

The winner will be entered into the Kansas Society SAR contest on March 18, at the Annual Conference in Olathe.

# 2022 Americanism Report Filed by Dennis Nelson, Americanism Chairman

In the Americanism contest, DX reported 13,648 points compared to 8,150 for 2021. In the President General Streamer contest, DX reported 7,175 points compared to 6,355 points for 2021. Combined totals were 20,823 points for 2022 compared to 14,505 for 2021.

Some highlights from the report are as follows:

- \$1,795 awarded to youth contestants from Kesler Youth Endowment Fund earnings
- 118 medals/certificates awarded to youth
- Chapter participated in 20 public service events including 7 Naturalization ceremonies
- Chapter participated in 16 historic celebrations which included 9 Honor Flight receptions at Kansas City International airport
- 25 programs presented by chapter members
- 51 certificates/medals were presented to non-SAR members
- 18 new members, 5 reinstatements and 0 supplementals
- State, district and national meetings attendance – 49
- Color guard attendance at events 139
- 75 media references from Non-SAR sources (3,750 points)

Congratulations to all chapter members for their efforts whether it is active participation in the chapter, participation in the color guard and/or providing financial support though dues and
