Mark your calendar and be sure to attend these two important events.








# DX 65<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Silent Auction Items

# Pat Donahue to present the August 9th Program.

It's a real privilege to have Pat Donahue present the August 9<sup>th</sup> meeting program on his experience as a Marine artillery officer in the Vietnam War. Pat was stationed along the DMZ (demilitarized zone) border area between South Vietnam and North Vietnam. His opponents were regular North Vietnamese Army troops, not Viet Cong guerillas.

He had two overlapping jobs. One was to provide direct offensive and defensive artillery fire support for the infantry unit that he was assigned to, and the other was to find targets of opportunity that artillery could engage with or without infantry support. Their guns were usually 5 miles or more away from our targets, so someone had to tell them where to shoot and to adjust them so they could hit the targets. That was Pat's job. This presentation focuses on how artillery works, who they were, how they were organized, the missions performed, and how they lived on a day-by-day basis. Being a soldier in a combat zone is a very different kind of job but it is still a job. This is the subject of his talk. He wants to thank you for your kind invitation to share with you. # Your Color Guard at Work

During the past month your Delaware Crossing Chapter Color Guardsmen have participated in more events than just our Chapter Meeting. On Sunday July 20, Dewey Fry and Clay Shropshire from Delaware Crossing, Alan Martin from Monticello Chapter and Delaware Crossing and KSSSAR Eastern District Adjutant Brian Vasquez from Thomas Jefferson Chapter presented the colors at a Kansas City Monarch baseball game in Kansas City, KS.

On Tuesday July 22, a Naturalization Ceremony was conducted at the Robert J. Dole US Courthouse in Kansas City, KS. There were 87 applicants from 43 country who took the Oath of Citizenship making them citizens of the United States of America. Dennis Nelson, Steven French and Dewey Fry from Delaware Crossing, Alan Martin and Jerry Vest from Monticello Chapter, John More from Charles Robinson Chapter and Brian Vazquez from Thomas Jefferson Chapter presented the colors and led the new citizens in our Pledge of Allegiance for the first time the applicant recited it as a United States citizen.

Many photos are taken, sometimes of the new citizen only, sometimes with many family members and sometimes with their spouse who has become a new citizen at the same time. The

photo session now lasts much longer than does the ceremonial court proceedings making them a citizen. One photo accompanying this article is of one new citizen surrounded by 9 family members; that, is a testament to the importance of the event to the new citizen.

At both the KC Monarchs game and the Naturalization Ceremony, Color Guardsmen received many verbal compliments from the fans at the baseball game and from the new citizens and their family members and friends at the reception following the ceremony.
