

The Color Guard Advanced, Presented and Posted the Colors for the meeting and picnic portion and the Memorial Service.

President Larry Tatum called the meeting of order and presided over the Meeting portion of the picnic, the Memorial Service and the Flag Retirement. Chaplain Bruce Smith conducted much of the Memorial Service which honored 20 SAR members who the KSSSAR had been notified during the past year of their deaths. At the time of their deaths 11 were Primary Members of the Delaware Crossing chapter, 4 were members of the Monticello Chapter and 5 were from the Henry Leavenworth Chapter.

As Larry Tatum read the meaning of each part of the flag, Boy Scouts Lucas House and Colin Hallier disassembled the flag assisted by Color Guardsmen Steven French and Alan Martin.

Steven French then placed each the union and each stripe into the flame. Representatives from 9 local DAR Chapters participated by placing cut portions of flags into the fire. Dee Clark of the John and Hattie Possum Chapter NSDAR Marla Thompson of the Quivira Crossing Chapter NSDAR aided by properly cutting apart several flag which had not been previously disassembled. Except for the breeze blowing the smoke into the shelter from the flags burning, it was a very enjoyable day; especially after eating a piece of the cake furnished by Larry Tatum to celebrate the 775th meeting of the Delaware Crossing Chapter.

65th Anniversary Celebration

We will celebrate the 65th Anniversary of the founding of our Delaware Crossing Chapter on November 15 at the meeting facility at the Grinter Place Historic Site, 1420 S. 78th Street, Kansas City, KS. It will be a luncheon meeting, followed by a visit to the Grinter House in which our chapter was founded on November 1, 1960. This is the first announcement; you will get another closer to the day of the event. Why are you getting it now? Because it will give you more time to save the event on your calendar and make a reservation **between October 20 and November 1**. As this is a catered event we must give them adequate notice.

We are planning a presentation by Kirk Rush on the history of our participation in the SAR Eagle Scout Contest, and the participation of some of our members and achievements of our chapter contestants at the national level. Also, Dennis Nelson will present a brief history of the Delaware Crossing Chapter Presidents, especially those who went on to State and National service.

The food will be catered by Pegah's Family Restaurant. The menu will be a choice of Country Fried Steak or Chicken Fried Chicken with a salad bar and sides of mashed potatoes and gravy and corn. Coffee, water and tea will be provided. Desert will be cake, two cakes will be provided of two different flavors and designed with themes in relation to the event.

There will be a Silent Auction to help reduce the cost the chapter is absorbing over and above that covered by the fee members will have to pay such as the facility rental which is \$400.00 and costs absorbed for invited District and National leaders who may attend.

Richard Woody is donating two wooden cutting boards and a book about George Washington.


Historic donations are preferred; however, you may donate any themed item of value for the silent auction. Just bring it to the November 15th meeting, or give it to Dewey Fry before that date.
