2016 Americanism Poster Contest

Our Delaware Crossing Chapter *Americanism Elementary School Poster Contest* can be declared a very good success this year. The chapter level winner this year, from Pioneer Ridge Middle School is Reece Guerrero. Her poster's theme as the Battle of Yorktown.



As stated by NSSAR, the poster contest is “intended to stimulate interest in American History in support of the Elementary School curriculum.”

In order to achieve that goal the students must participate and, the classroom teacher must be willing to participate. For several years, we have been met with refusal after refusal by 5th grade teachers to participate in public, parochial, and private schools and those who are home schooled.

When I presented a program to a DAR Chapter in September 2015, Mrs. Vickie Chandler (5th grade teacher at Pioneer Ridge Middle School) approached my wife and asked if we had any youth programs and we spoke briefly. Mrs. Chandler called me a few days later, the more we discussed the poster contest the more she became enthused. She talked with the other five 5th grade teachers and the Principal. Mrs. Chandler's participation in the program added to the success.

All in all, there were 144 students participating from 5 classes and all made posters. The teaching staff graciously prejudged the 144 posters, narrowing down our choices to 18 from which we selected a winner.

In attendance for the program our chapter presented in the school auditorium were the 5th grade students, their teachers, some of their parents, grandparents, younger siblings, staff and administration. The program was a success; it included the describing of five flags, answering questions about a Charleville Musket and our uniforms, and demonstrating the cutting of a five-pointed star with one snip of the scissors as Betsy Ross purportedly demonstrated.
