Spring Honor Flights at KCI

The Kansas Society Color Guard commanded by Compatriot Dewey Fry, was invited by the Missouri Society Color Guard to participate in the welcome back of Honor Flights to Kansas City International airport.

An Honor Flight is a flight on which veterans go to Washington DC, tour several of the sites and most often ret urn the same day. It is at no cost to the veterans. There is a host for each veteran by from the sponsoring group.

The MOSSAR Color Guard, and KSSSAR Color Guard when invited, participate with the Patriot Guard Riders to welcome the veterans back as they exit from the secured area. The veterans exit the plane last. The welcoming them back and thanking them for their service is a surprise to most.

The Honor Flights dates, sponsoring organizations were as follows:

April 15, Southern Coffee County KS High School Honor Flights (Steven French's home county). April 26, Southern Lyon County KS Honor Flight April 28, Wamego KS High School Honor Flight. May 18, Honor Flight Network of KC May 25, Parsons KS High School Honor Flight June 6, Central Heights Southeast High School Honor Flight

At least one KSSSAR Color Guardsman participated the welcoming back of each Honor Flight. Most often there were multiples.

Three from DX participated for during the spring schedule. They were Dewey Fry, Kirk Rush and Steven French.

The May 18 Honor Flights was the largest in the history of those arriving at KCI, it had 90 veterans plus escort, so large that it was a charter flight. Other flights were commercial flights that had 20 to 48 veterans.

They May 18 Honor Fight was welcomed home by a combined Color Guard; from MOSSAR were Mark Parks, Robert Grover, Stephen Sullins, James Scott, John Stewart, and Roy Hutchinson, from KSSSAR were Dewey Fry, Steven French, Kirk Rush and Alan Martin, several DAR ladies and a large contingent of Patriot Guard Riders. There were so many participating in the Color Guards that one photo could not be arranged.

A crowd of well over 200 people welcomed the veterans back home and thanked them for their service. KC Wolf and four of the Kansas City Chiefs Cheerleaders were present, KC Wolf even had to have his picture taken with SAR Color Guardsmen. 90 students from one nearby high school were in attendance and local television station covered the event.

Before the veterans arrived, Roy Hutchinson entertained the large crowed by playing patriot

songs and the armed forces songs on a fife. One lady led the crowd in singing America the Beautiful. One photo shows the large crowd with the Color Guards in the distance, another taken in the other direction.

Dewey Fry approached KC Wolf and stated that he had heard that the KC Wolf, wanted to have his picture taken with some Color Guardsmen.
