Americanism Chairman, Dennis Nelson has received the results of the 2022 Americanism Report and the Delaware Crossing Chapter ranks 8th in the Nation. The report assigns a number value for the Chapter functions that are the goals of the Sons of the American Revolution. Other committee reports tabulate values regarding a specific area, but Americanism spans the activities that are the purpose and goals of the SAR education, community evolvement, patriotism.

Most importantly to me, we achieved this high status by participating in the functions that are important and gratifying to us. Not to purposely try to score points, but to be meaningfully engaged with our community.

Congratulations to the Delaware Crossing Chapter for being recognized nationally as a Top Tier SAR Chapter.

Final Results of the 2022 Americanism Contest by Dennis Nelson, Americanism Chairman

The NSSAR has posted on its website the details of the 2022 Americanism /President General's Streamer Award contest. Delaware Crossing Chapter competed with 42 chapters that submitted reports for the category of 91-150 members. There were four membership categories and a total of 237 chapters submitted reports.

Americanism recognizes chapters that participate in outreach education efforts and who acknowledge community leaders for their efforts to perpetuate the goals of the SAR. In the Americanism contest DX finished 3rd (2021 - 3rd) with 14,013 points. Compared to all chapters filing reports, DX ranked 8th out of 237 and was the only chapter in the top eight west of the Mississippi River.

The President General's Streamer contest recognizes chapters for their efforts to achieve the administrative goals of the SAR and who contribute to the success of the SAR. In the PG Streamer contest, DX was 2nd (2021 - 3rd) with 7,175 points.

The President General's Cup recognizes chapters that best achieves the goals of both Americanism and President General's Streamer award contest. In the President General's Cup contest, the points for Americanism and PG Streamer are combined and divided by the number of members in the chapter to arrive at an average of overall points per member. DX scored in 12 out of 13 categories, qualifying to compete for the President General's Cup. DX finished 3rd $(2021 - 4^{th})$ with a 139.50 average points per member.

Congratulations to all chapter members for their efforts whether it is active participation in the chapter and/or providing financial support though dues and donations.

These results clearly demonstrate that Delaware Crossing is one of the best SAR chapters in NSSAR for both outreach and administrative support of SAR programs.

Color Guard Medals are earned based on an Event or Point program established by the National Society Sons of the American Revolution. A color guardsman must earn 300 pts over a 3-year period. Points are 5 for chapter events and 10 for state events.

As you can see by the smile on his face, this was a significant achievement.

After the ceremony the Color Guard stood in the large entry for an hour so the new citizens and their families could have one or more photos with us. This a custom we have participated in for several years.





Please make you reservation by 8:00 PM Friday September 8.






Dennis Nelson presents an article on a Moment in the American Revolution.
